Let's face it - COVID-19 turned our world upside down. The most vulnerable populations were left needing supports that service providers, the community and our leaders had yet to design. TeleHealth, Zoom meetings and self-isolation became mandated. A new world was emerging overnight, expecting us to adapt quickly.

At the Learning Disabilities Association of WNY (LDA), we know that successful independence relies on stability – and that **our staff and board needed to be that stable force for the people we support.** Staying connected, and building those bridges for connection with each other and the community, has been our main priority.

Here's some of what LDA did to respond:

The Starlight Studio & Art Gallery staff got art supplies to its artists and launched Zoom Hangouts so all could safely make art together from their homes; our LEAD 716 team stayed engaged with families, creating "learning kits" comprised of much-needed learning materials while offering virtual tutoring; Community Habilitation staff ensured their clients had access to groceries, medical appointments and socially distanced walks; our residential clients had the peace of mind knowing they lived in a clean, safe, and supportive environment.

All across WNY, from Orleans to Chautauqua to Allegheny Counties, our staff continued to ensure that the 1,200 individuals with disabilities we serve each year had the supports to live an independent and meaningful life in their community.

Community Habilitation promotes independence and community integration by providing flexible and scaled supports and services to help individuals develop skills necessary to achieve the outcomes most important to them.

Starlight Studio & Art Gallery is a vibrant art studio located in downtown Buffalo that supports adults with disabilities in their artistic development.

ILearn provides adults a relaxing, fun and exciting setting to socialize with peers, make new friends and gain greater community independence.

Vocational Employment Services help adults get and keep a job. This has been especially challenging during a time when so many people have lost their jobs.

The Learning Center is our adult education center located at Goodwill Industries at 1119 William St., Buffalo NY. TLC offers adult basic education and TASC preparation classes with experienced teachers at a convenient location.

LEAD716 is a free program aimed to provide critically-needed early academic intervention to preschool children in Western New York diagnosed with elevated lead levels in their blood. LEAD716 mentoring focuses on early literacy skill development and helps ensure the children are prepared for success in kindergarten and beyond.
